- 1. Review of proposed local law for solar panels.
  - Why? To protect farmland.
  - How much land is needed? At least 20 acres. 30 acres would produce a megawatt.
  - Substation required? More research needed.
  - Put on wasteland? Possibly.
  - Rent from solar panels? \$1500/acre.
  - Landowner rights? Includes being a good neighbor.
  - Personal use of solar panels? Shouldn't be discouraged.
  - Location of panels? Use land quality designation.
  - Definition of large scale? More research needed.
  - A consensus was reached that work on the proposed local law for solar panels should proceed. Costs involved with this should be clearly identified.
- 2. Discussion of cheese factory (odor) accident.
  - Although the odor has subsided it lasted much of the summer.
  - The situation will continue to be monitored.
- 3. Discussion of clear cutting of Fraser woods.
  - A 20 to 30 acre clear-cut may require SEQR review.
  - Sodbuster laws may initiate a review for clear cutting.
  - An investor group, CERES from Indiana, owns the land.
  - Noblehurst clear-cut mistakes were discovered after the fact (DEC).
  - Bob Striker of Livingston County Soil and Water may be of assistance in this case.
- 4. Other
  - It was suggested that the CAC ask the Town Board for official recognition.
