### York Town Board Meeting September 13<sup>th</sup>, 2022 7:00 p.m.

Present: Supervisor Gerald Deming, Council Members: Frank Rose Jr., Amos Smith, Norman Gates and Jason Swede

Supervisor Deming opened the Town Board Meeting at 7:00 p.m. and invited Councilman Rose to lead in the Pledge of Allegiance.

### **MINUTES**

RESOLUTION offered by Mr. Swede and seconded by Mr. Smith to approve the minutes of the Regular Town Board Meeting of August 9th, Special Meeting of August 17th, and Public Hearing & Special Town Board Meeting of September 6, 2022. Voted on and approved, Yes-5, No-o.

### **BILLS:**

RESOLUTION offered by Mr. Smith and seconded by Mr. Swede to approve all claims brought before the Board. Voted on and approved, Yes-5, No-o.

### **PRIVILEGES OF THE FLOOR:**

1)Henry Fuller:

Mr. Fuller asked to speak with the Board regarding a number of water questions:

Q-What is the status of the Livingston County Water & Sewer Authority matter?

Supervisor Deming answered that the Authority (Jason Molino) filed for grant funding last week.

Q- Did the rest of the Towns/Villages go with it?

Supervisor Deming responded that the majority of the agencies expressed interest with

the exception of the Town and Village of Geneseo, they chose not to participate.

Q- Why are we not allowed to use the money from the Salt Mine?

Supervisor Deming answered, the way the agreement was prepared by the Attorney General, monies could only be used for certain projects, such as for sources of water and improvement to quality of water. We could not use the money for installation of water lines.

Q- Is water actually needed on River Road?

Supervisor Deming reported that we did have a resident of Craig Road (near River Road) attend the Informational meeting with Jason Molino asking about water for the area. Clerk Harris added, a couple of years ago the Board received a petition for water from River Road residents. CPL prepared figures on a potential line, it was determined that the cost was too high to proceed.

Q- Do you know where Jason Molino came from?

Supervisor Deming and Attorney Campbell replied that they do know where Mr. Molino was previously and gave a brief background history.

Q- How much are we paying the Highway guys per hour?

Mr. Worden stated that we have a tiered contract with the employees and would have to get back to Mr. Fuller on the breakdown of each worker per hour.

Q- New York State DOT had an advertisement in the paper looking for workers with an \$18.00 per hour rate plus benefits, is the Town rate more?

Supervisor Deming and Mr. Worden stated that we do offer more, recently the rate was increased to \$26.76 per hour.

### **HIGHWAY REPORT:**

Mr. Worden reported the following for the Highway Department:

- The Department installed a 5-foot culvert on Cowan Road
- Mowing of cemeteries continues.
- We have been trimming brush and ash trees
- Conducting routine truck maintenance

Mr. Worden reported at our last meeting on September 6, he informed the Board that Highway employee John Pike had expressed his decision to return to Caledonia Town Highway Dept. Mr. Pike spoke with Mr. Worden today about his desire to stay with the Town of York if Mr. Worden is still able to do so. Mr. Worden stated that Mr. Pike is a very good worker and would like for him to continue.

Supervisor Deming replied with the fact that Mr. Pike will remain with the Town of York Highway Department, we will not need to advertise now for this position.

### **WATER/SEWER REPORT:**

Mr. Worden reported the following for the Water & Sewer Department:

- Water meters are being read at this time for the October cycle
- Regarding THM's, our running average is a 66 but the read coming into us from Geneseo was a 79. With the maximum limit at 80, we have little room to work with. We were over the limit in Fowlerville with an 86 but due to usage of our Grid Bee, it has reduced the THM's and assisted our average tremendously. Geneseo does not have a Grid Bee.
- Rt. 20 Water customers received their letter allowing for connection to the municipal water line.
- York Rd. West waterline; water is on and short side homeowners may begin to connect. We have long side services to be done next week, once completed, those customers will be able to connect as well.

Councilman Rose inquired if we have a status regarding Piffard material, which Mr. Worden replied we have not received an updated timetable when the material will be arriving. Core & Main stated to us back in August when we approved the bid that it may take up to 10 weeks.

Mr. Fuller asked if the new water line is going to take care of the THM'S for us?

Mr. Worden replied with the tests the LCWSA currently run, THM'S have not been an issue and they do not foresee issues going forward. Mr. Worden commented that the Grid Bee works extremely well.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

1)Pay Application #3:

a-Fineline Pipeline:

RESOLUTION offered by Mr. Smith and seconded by Mr. Rose to approve Pay Application #3 for Fineline Pipeline Inc in the amount of \$87,546.54 for the Route 20 watermain extension project. Voted on and approved, Yes-5, No-0.

### EXTRACT OF MINUTES OF MEETING OF THE TOWN BOARD ADOPTING BOND RESOLUTION

At a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of York, Livingston County, New York, held at the Town Offices in York, New York, on the 13th day of September, 2022:

PRESENT: Supervisor Gerald L. Deming, Councilmen: Frank Rose Jr., Amos Smith, Jason Swede and Norman Gates

ABSENT: None

Councilman Smith presented the following resolution and duly moved that it be adopted and was seconded by Councilman Gates:

BOND RESOLUTION DATED SEPTEMBER 13, 2022 OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF YORK, NEW YORK, AUTHORIZING GENERAL OBLIGATION SERIAL BONDS TO FINANCE WATER SYSTEM CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS WITHIN THE TOWN, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN CONTEMPLATION THEREOF, THE EXPENDITURE OF SUMS FOR SUCH PURPOSE, AND DETERMINING OTHER MATTERS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.

WHEREAS, the Town of York Consolidated Water District NYS Route 20 Extension is a Water District Extension of the Town of York, New York, duly established by the Town Board pursuant to the Town Law; and

WHEREAS, the cost of the improvements authorized will not exceed the cost thresholds that require approval of the Office of the State Comptroller; and

WHEREAS, the Town, acting as lead agency under the State Environmental Quality Review Act and the applicable regulations promulgated thereunder ("SEQRA"), has completed its environmental review and, on June 8, 2021, has duly adopted a negative declaration and has determined that the implementation of the unlisted action as proposed will not result in any significant adverse environmental impacts; now therefor, be it

RESOLVED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF YORK, NEW YORK (hereinafter referred to as the "Town"), by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all of the members of such Board, as follows:

Section 1. The Town of York shall undertake certain capital improvements consisting of the acquisition and construction of water improvements for the Town of York Consolidated Water District NYS Route 20 Extension, to include the installation of approximately 14,160 linear feet of 2 inch, 4 inch and 8 inch water main, with hydrants, valves and other appurtenant infrastructure, and the acquisition of land or rights in land necessary therefor, if any, and the acquisition of original furnishings, equipment, machinery or apparatus, or the replacement of such equipment, machinery or apparatus, and other incidental improvements that may be required in connection therewith for such construction and district use (hereinafter referred to as "purpose"), and general obligation serial bonds in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$673,000 of the Town are hereby authorized to be issued to finance said purpose, and bond anticipation notes in anticipation thereof (and renewals thereof) of the Town are hereby authorized to be issued to finance said purpose.

Section 2. The estimated maximum aggregate cost to the Town of York of said purpose, which may include preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and costs of the financing thereof, is estimated to be \$673,000, and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. The plan for financing of said purpose is to provide all of such maximum cost by issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes as herein authorized, to be offset and reduced dollar for dollar by the amount of grants received, presently estimated to be up to \$362,372 of Livingston County grant funds and a SAM grant.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and declared that (a) said purpose is one of the class of objects or purposes described in Subdivision 1 of Paragraph (a) of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, and that the period of probable usefulness of said purpose is forty (40) years, (b) the proposed maximum maturity of said bonds authorized by this resolution will be in excess of five years, (c) current funds required to be provided prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes herein authorized, pursuant to Section 107.00 of the Local Finance Law, to the extent applicable, if any, will be provided, (d) the notes herein authorized are issued in anticipation of bonds for an assessable improvement, and (e) there are presently no outstanding bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds.

Section 4. The bonds and notes authorized by this resolution shall contain the recital of validity prescribed in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and such bonds and notes shall be general obligations of the Town and all the taxable real property in the Town is subject to the levy of ad valorem taxes to pay the principal thereof, and interest thereon, without limitation as to rate or amount, subject to applicable statutory limitations, if any, sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds and notes.

Section 5. It is hereby determined and declared that the Town reasonably expects to reimburse the general fund, or such other fund as may be utilized, not to exceed the maximum amount authorized herein, from the proceeds of the obligations authorized hereby for expenditures, if any, from such fund that may be made for the purpose prior to the date of the issuance of such obligations. This is a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation §1.150-2.

Section 6. The power to further authorize the sale, issuance and delivery of said bonds and notes and to prescribe the terms, form and contents of said bonds and notes, including, without limitation, the consolidation with other issues, the determination to issue bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, all contracts for, and determinations with respect to, credit or liquidity enhancements, if any, and to sell and deliver said bonds and notes, subject to the provisions of this resolution and the provisions of the Local Finance Law, including without limitation, the authority to determine whether to accept bids electronically to the extent allowed by the Local Finance Law, is hereby delegated to the Town Supervisor, the Town's chief fiscal officer. The Town Supervisor and the Town Clerk or Deputy Clerk are hereby authorized to sign by manual or facsimile signature and attest any bonds and notes issued pursuant to this resolution, and are hereby authorized to affix to such bonds and notes the corporate seal of the Town of York.

Section 7. The faith and credit of the Town of York, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes as the same respectively become due and payable. Such bonds and notes shall be payable from a levy on real property in such district benefitted or user charges therefor, in the manner provided by law, but if not paid from such source, all the taxable real property in the Town is subject to the levy of ad valorem taxes to pay the principal thereof, and interest thereon, without limitation as to rate or amount, subject to applicable statutory limitations, if any, sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds and notes. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations becoming due and payable in such year.

Section 8. This resolution, or a summary hereof, shall be published in full by the Town Clerk of the Town of York together with a notice in substantially the form prescribed by Section 81.00 of said Local Finance Law, and such publication shall be in each official newspaper of the Town, in the manner prescribed by law. The validity of said bonds or of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds may be contested only if such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said Town is not authorized to expend money, or the provisions of law which should be complied with, at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication; or if said obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 9. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

The motion having been duly seconded, it was adopted and the following votes were cast:

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#### NOTICE PURSUANT TO LOCAL FINANCE LAW SECTION 81.00

The bond resolution published herewith was adopted on September 13, 2022, and the validity of the obligations authorized by such bond resolution may be hereafter contested only if such obligations were authorized for an object or purpose for which the Town of York is not authorized to expend money or if the provisions of law which should have been complied with as of the date of publication of this notice were not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of publication of this notice, or such obligations were authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.
